Vincent Lagendijk is an assistant professor in the history department at Maastricht University. Vincent was trained as an economic historian at Leiden University, and subsequently did a PhD in history of technology at Eindhoven University of Technology. He was a visiting lecturer at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens in 2019, and was named postdoctoral fellow at the German Historical Institute in Washington D.C for 2017-2018. He is primarily interested in the history of international organizations, the role of experts and technology, and transnational connections. He has worked on the notion of "Europe" in relation to the construction of electricity networks, and is currently preparing a monograph on a global history of the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA). His most recent research focuses on the intersection of road-building and racism in the city of Baltimore.
