Profile

- Doctorate in psychology or equivalent;
- Strong academic teaching record;
- Proven research record in one or more of the following areas: sustainable careers, life-long learning, life-long career guidance, social and occupational insertion and integration, resources and vulnerabilities in unstable and shifting labour markets, promoting well-being at work;
- Experience in career guidance and counselling would be an advantage;
- Strong international networks;
- Openness to a wide range of research methods — qualitative, quantitative and mixed — would be an advantage.

Teaching (45%)

Six hours of teaching a week, throughout the year, at Bachelor (BA) and Master (MA) levels, determined in accordance with institutional requirements, including:

- Introductory lecture course in vocational psychology (BA level, 28 hours, 3 ECTS)
- Seminar in research design and methods (BA level seminar, 56 hours, annual, 6 ECTS)
- Lecture course in psychology of life-long educational guidance and career counseling, precise topic to be determined according to the candidate's area of research (MA level lecture course, 56 hours, 6 ECTS)
- Seminar in psychology of life-long educational guidance and career counseling, precise topic to be determined according to the candidate's area of expertise (MA level seminar, 28 hours, 3 ECTS)

Supervision of MA theses and PhD dissertations.



Research (45%)

The post-holder will pursue research in the psychology of life-long educational guidance and career counseling, on one of the topics indicated above (sustainable careers, life-long learning, life-long career guidance, etc.). The post-holder will be affiliated to one of the research centres in the Institute of Psychology. S/he will be expected to produce high-quality academic publications.

S/he will seek external funding, in particular from the Swiss National Science Foundation (SNSF).

Collaboration with the LIVES national research centre on Overcoming Vulnerability: Life Course Perspectives (PRN LIVES) is also possible.

Administrative responsibilities (10%)

In accordance with statutory requirements and in the name of collegiality, the post-holder will take on any administrative tasks that may be assigned by the Institute, Faculty, University or university decision-making bodies.

Institutional environment

The post is located in the Institute of Psychology (IP) and the Faculty of Social and Political Sciences.

Candidates are invited to submit their application **in PDF format** via **the online recruitment system** containing a cover letter, academic CV (**including list of publications**), copies of diplomas and qualifications and five representative publications.
