

First-Year Courses

- Anglo-American Literature Survey (AALS)
- Introduction to Literary Analysis (ILA)
- English Composition (EC)
- Introduction to English Language and Linguistics (IELL)
- Discovery: Medieval English (spring semester)
- All autumn courses start in Week 2 of the semester

Anglo-American Literature Survey (AALS)

- A three-semester lecture course (entire first year and first semester of the second year) introducing you to English and American literature from the early Renaissance up to the twentieth century
- First year: Wednesday 17.15-18.00

Introduction to Literary Analysis (ILA)

- A two-semester course introducing you to close reading of literary texts and discussion of literary concepts
 - Autumn semester: poetry
 - Spring semester: drama and prose
- Pre-register online to be allocated a place in one of the seven groups

English Composition (EC)

- A two-semester course providing practice in writing a critical essay in English
 - Autumn: literature essays
 - Spring: linguistics essays
- Pre-register online to be allocated a place in one of the seven groups

Introduction to English Language and Linguistics (IELL)


- A two-semester course introducing you to the scientific study of the English language and how it is used
- Weekly lecture and tutorial
- Lecture: Tuesday 15.15-16.00
- AND pre-register online to be allocated a place in one of the seven tutorials

Discovery: Medieval English

- A one-semester course introducing you to the culture and literature of Anglo-Saxon and Medieval England, studying texts in Old and Middle English
- The lecture and workshops take place in the Spring semester
